

Changemaker Medical Resident & Student Advocacy Awards



Nomination Form

The Changemaker Award honours one medical resident and one medical student who have demonstrated exemplary leadership and dedication in advancing the policies, views, and goals of Doctors of BC or a Resident or Student organization, through grassroots advocacy efforts. The awards were originally developed through the Doctors of BC’s Council on Public Affairs and Communications (CPAC).

Each Medical Resident or Student nominee must:

1. Be enrolled in full-time studies during the year of nomination.
2. Be registered as a Doctors of BC member in good standing.
3. Demonstrate outstanding personal advocacy for political or medical issues in British Columbia. This can be done by actively participating in grassroots political advocacy (example: working constructively with elected officials to improve the political climate, supporting quality patient care, or a strong health care system) and/or medical advocacy (working with stakeholders to improve the health care provided for the citizens of British Columbia, or improving the educational process for Medical Residents or Students)

Each award recipient will receive an engraved plaque and a \$2,000 cheque, and will be featured in the *BC Medical Journal* and on the Doctors of BC website. Winners will also be invited to the Doctors of BC’s Annual Awards Ceremony in May 2020 where they will be presented with their award.

Nomination deadline is Friday, April 3, 2020.

Nominations may be submitted by a Doctors of BC member, an affiliate or an associate society, or an MLA, and must include:

1. Completed nomination form, including the signature of the person being nominated.
2. A detailed letter of nomination (350 words max) with description of nominee's political involvement and/or medical advocacy activities.
3. Two letters of support
4. The nominee's curriculum vitae

Please note:

- A nomination may be re-submitted in a subsequent year, but must be updated to reflect the current year.
- Handwritten submissions will not be accepted.
- Self-nomination is ineligible.
