Hello – my name is Emil Lee. I am a diagnostic and interventional radiologist who has been happy to serve the communities of Langley, Abbotsford and Fraser East for the past 21 years.

I have had the great opportunity to take on leadership roles locally, provincially, nationally and internationally, as Local Department Head of Langley Memorial Hospital Medical Imaging for 14 years, President of the BC Radiological Society, Board member on the American College of Radiologists Board of Chancellors, and nationally as President of the Canadian Association of Radiologists (CAR). Equity, Diversity and Inclusivity are not just the latest buzzwords but fundamental principles that I believe physicians are in a unique position to make positive changes happen in our Province. As a member of the CAR EDI oversight committee and the EDI statement working group, I have helped craft our organization's EDI statement and am working together with others to create a toolkit to enable groups and organizations create their own EDI committees to embrace diversity, promote equity, and foster inclusivity to quote the CAR statement. I hope to continue that work on the Doctors of BC Board.

Finally, representation of physicians in BC is very important to me. I believe doctors have a fundamental role to play in shaping our health care system to meet the challenges of this pandemic and the health care crises and opportunities to come. As a member of the senior leadership group of physicians in the FHA I believe I can serve as a bridge between doctors and health authority administration to help define how we can work together to make our system more sustainable and successful into the future.
