

## How do I join the Representative Assembly?

There are two ways you can become a Representative Assembly (RA) delegate:

## 1. Be nominated and then elected for one of the following positions:

- a. District Delegates
- b. First Nations Delegates
- c. Rural Delegates
- d. Speaker and Deputy Speaker (nominated by membership; elected by the RA)
- To access the nomination papers enabling you to run for election, please click <a href="here">here</a>.
- To nominate a colleague or to be nominated to run for election for one of the above positions, you must be a member in good standing (i.e. have your 2017 membership dues paid) by the time the call for nominations is sent. This is expected to take place in early May.
- To nominate a colleague or to be nominated to run for a First Nations or Rural delegate
  position, you must provide services to the First Nations Health Authority and/or provide
  rural care within the scope of the <u>Rural Subsidiary Agreement (RSA)</u>.

## 2. Be appointed by your Section or representative organization. These organizations are:

- a. Society of General Practitioners (SGP)
- b. Specialists of BC (SBC)
- c. Canadian Medical Association (CMA)
- d. Resident Doctors of BC
- e. Medical Undergraduate Society
- To be appointed for these positions, you must be a member of the section or representative organization. Please connect with them directly for more information.
