### **Synopsis**

### Physicians want a simple, fulsome sharing of patient information across the province with a few exceptions

- 56% of members are satisfied with their current EMR; 43% are satisfied with their EMR vendor
- Changing EMRs is a time consuming and expensive process
- The current number of EMRs creates fragmented communications
- EMRs in the community and across hospitals don't communicate with each other
- Some have experienced what they view as superior systems in Alberta, the US or New Zealand

#### Context limits the ability to design and belief that an optimal system is possible

- Bad change experiences
- Unique workflows and needs
- Difficult to use current systems
- Distrust of Health Authorities and the Ministry of Health


#### Personal ideology and beliefs also inform how the system should be governed


- Competition breeds innovation and reduced costs

- Corporate monopolies will not serve the interests of patients or physicians


#### Respondent's conclusion





















If third-party management – 45% prefer Doctors of BC.




